



## FIELD TRIP INFORMATION

Group rates are for groups of 10 or more: \$2.00 per child and \$4.00 per adult.  
For every 10 children, one adult receives complimentary admission.

The AG Museum strongly suggests bringing at least one adult for every 10 students. If there are more than 10 paying adults, they are eligible for the adult group rate of \$4.00 if all are paid together. Adults will be charged the regular admission rate of \$5.00 if they pay separately. **These rates do not apply to special museum events. We recommend allowing at least 1 ½ - 2 hours to fully experience everything the museum has to offer. The Ag Museum includes indoor and outdoor exhibits, so dress for the weather and bring umbrellas or rain coats if needed. Classes are welcome to bring sack lunches. Picnic tables are available throughout the campus, and are first-come, first-served. There are also plenty of grassy areas and picnic blankets are always welcome!

Enhance the fun of your field trip with the following options:

- Train rides for \$1 per rider
- Carousel rides for \$1 per rider (kindergarten and under only)
- Popcorn and Coke for \$2 per person  
(Drink substitutions are available upon request – additional charges may apply).

Pricing information is located on the Field Trip Request Form. Please let us know at least **one week before** your visit if you would like to add these options. Changes in the number of people in your group must be communicated to the museum at least **48 hours prior** to your visit.

Please be advised that your group will be sharing the museum with other groups and individual visitors during your visit. If any child or group of children is being unruly, misbehaving, or being extremely disrespectful to Museum staff and property, the Museum reserves the right to ask the group to leave.
